## **Assembly of The Sacred Wheel Code of Ethics**

- 1 To fulfill the goals of their incarnation, it is the duty of every member is to seek the knowledge of why they were born into this lifetime, culture, and time.
- 2 Acts that unnecessarily impede the free will or the evolutionary process of an individual are considered baneful. Acts that unnecessarily impede the free will or the evolutionary process of a population are considered baneful.
- 3 We hold the physical world and incarnation as divine gifts and sacred and, therefore, hold the bodily sovereignty and autonomy of each individual to be divine and an essential right.
- 4 As bearers of the divine spark of the Great Ones, we are called to look for and honor the presence of the divine in all the beings using higher love as our guide.
- 5 We should be ever mindful that the Greater Earth is our mother and honor that sacred relationship.
- 6 In coming to a conclusion, use the Three Modes of Thought and the Five Wits, avoiding over-reliance on any one way of reaching a judgment.

The Three Modes are summarized as:

- The Reductive/Analytical
- The Creative/Aesthetic
- The Ecological/Conservative

The Five Wits are named as:

- Heart
- Imagination
- Intelligence
- Courage
- Spiritual Hope
- When making choices, bring your web of duties, responsibilities, and the potential results, and consequences into as great a harmony as you are capable.

- 8 In determining the ethical status of any action or position, consider whether there will be a long-term increase in the richness, diversity, and viability of the community as a whole, with "community" including the life of the Greater Earth in all its forms and essences.
- 9 Members are charged with the sacred ethical obligation of passing on magickal and spiritual teachings to all who seek and desire them. Members are encouraged to extend the teachings through research, and to act as ethical stewards for the elder lore.
